transferred to your device.


Back to the Office, Hybrid

After more than two years of remote work, on April 4th, the AcenTek staff went back to the office. Sort of. The staff was given the option of working a hybrid schedule. This option allows staff to work from home two or three days each week, while reporting to the office on the remaining days.

Some employees prefer to work remotely, some prefer to be in the office, and still others see the benefit of both. "Having the flexibility to work from home and be in the office is the perfect arrangement, in my opinion," says Kendra Eide, Purchasing Coordinator. "If I have a project that I need some uninterrupted time to work through, a day at my home office is perfect. If I need to collaborate with a co-worker on a project, that might be easier in person. I love having that flexibility."

"AcenTek is a progressive company. We are always trying to improve and that's not just with our customers, but also with our staff. With that in mind, we decided the hybrid option would be offered as our staff came back to the office. Each department will be evaluating productivity and task completion rates so that we can use those measurements for future decisions about the work options for our team," said Kim Connor, Human Resources Manager.

With an increase in retirements, a decision about work schedule options could play a significant role in hiring at AcenTek. On average, there are two or three employees who retire each year, but in the last year, a record nine employees retired. Many of our employees are long-term employees so this trend is inevitable. So, we plan for this. AcenTek is proud of the work environment we have created and are optimistic that we will continue to fill the voids left by these valuable team members with new, qualified candidates. "We



will continue to evaluate new options that help with the work/ life balance, both for existing staff and for our future hires," says Connor.

In addition to the staff being back in the office, our lobby is now open two days a week. For the past two years, AcenTek has successfully served you, our customer, remotely. While many of our customers have adapted to these new ways and found them to be far more convenient, some customers prefer to do business in person. For that reason, we have re-opened our lobby on Mondays and Thursdays, from 8:00am-4:30pm to serve you.

Channel Numbers Changing

At the end of June, video customers will notice a change to their service. Many channel numbers are changing. No channels are leaving our lineup, but your favorite shows may soon be on a new channel. This change will take place at the end of June. Community, music and premium channels (HBO, Cinemax, Showtime and Starz Encore) will not be affected. Realigning the channels let the different viewing genres to be organized together, while also allowing room for adding HD channels, as they become available. This change will not impact your DVR library or parental controls.



Customers in Minnesota will notice the updated lineup on June 28th, while customers in lowa will see the change on June 29th. All video customers received a new lineup brochure with their June bill. An Update on Fiber Projects

Recent years have proven that fiber optics are essential to every customer. Despite the hurdles encountered due to the pandemic and supply chain issues, we continue to make progress on our goal of enhancing every customer's life by providing unparalleled services. Fiber optics make that mission a reality. While the amount of time and expense are substantial for every fiber build, we have a plan for how to bring fiber to more of our customers throughout 2022.

Phase one of building fiber to customers in our Mesick exchange began in early May. We estimate construction to be complete by September. This project covers over 95 miles around the Mesick area and will bring fiber to over 1,000 homes.

AcenTek did receive the Ironfish grant for the Copemish exchange, meaning we will bring fiber to 56 rural customers in the Thompsonville area. The project will begin in September with an estimated date of completion of mid-October.





We were excited to award 20 high school seniors with \$1,000 scholarships this spring. These deserving recipients are graduating seniors who have been accepted to a college or university and have AcenTek phone or broadband service in Minnesota, lowa, or Michigan. Over the past 21 years, AcenTek has given out \$405,000 to graduates in the communities we serve.

Brys Estate Vineyard & Winery

Brys Estate Vineyard & Winery stands out next to other wineries. Spanning 155 acres, the family-run business is focused on providing the full experience to their guests.

It is the largest winery on the Old Mission Peninsula and within that space they have created many special areas. Guests are welcome in the tasting room, or on their upper deck, which sits elevated above the vineyard and offers a spectacular view. There is also a lawn bar so guests can enjoy their drink on the green. Guests also can visit the Secret Garden, where lavender plants and a strawberry patch offer the ingredients for Lavender Lemonade and Moomer's Ice Cream in their gift shop. They even have a wine wagon, where guests can taste and tour all the estate has to offer.

The legacy began in 2001, when a modest 10,000 grape vines were planted on the estate. Four years later, the doors to the tasting room opened for the first time. Today, Brys vineyard consists of 53,000 vines. They grow eight different varietals, including both red and white grapes. Their growth is not only be measured by size, but also by accomplishments. The vineyard has earned over 500 medals at national and international wine competitions.

The small team at Brys prides themselves on giving visitors something they cannot get elsewhere. "Traditional, yet unconventional" is how they describe their business. They continue to follow the techniques that have worked for years but are also unafraid to jump at any new opportunity that presents itself. This could be the recipe for their success.

The success and growth of Brys didn't come without some growing pains. As they began to expand and include more locations on their property, their technology needs also grew. They soon realized the need for a phone system that would allow for their multiple sites to operate as one business. AcenTek was able to help Brys with a solution. A new phone system allowed the staff to take calls at a separate location,

Distance no longer mattered. Fiber services at Brys Estate provided a reliable connection for the business so that they could complete their day-to-day tasks without interruption. 


TODD ROESLER CEO
