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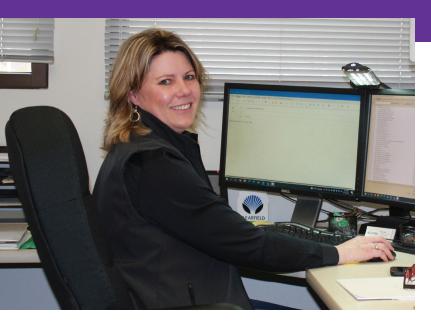


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# Back to the Office, Hybrid



After more than two years of remote work, on April 4th, the AcenTek staff went back to the office. Sort of. The staff was given the option of working a hybrid schedule. This option allows staff to work from home two or three days each week, while reporting to the office on the remaining days.

Some employees prefer to work remotely, some prefer to be in the office, and still others see the benefit of both. "Having the flexibility to work from home and be in the office is the perfect arrangement, in my opinion," says Kendra Eide, Purchasing Coordinator. "If I have a project that I need some uninterrupted time to work through, a day at my home office is perfect. If I need to collaborate with a co-worker on a project, that might be easier in person. I love having that flexibility."

"AcenTek is a progressive company. We are always trying to improve and that's not just with our customers, but also with our staff. With that in mind, we decided the hybrid option would be offered as our staff came back to the office. Each department will be evaluating productivity and task completion rates so that we can use those measurements for future decisions about the work options for our team," said Kim Connor, Human Resources Manager.

With an increase in retirements, a decision about work schedule options could play a significant role in hiring at AcenTek. On average, there are two or three employees who retire each year, but in the last year, a record nine employees retired. Many of our employees are long-term employees so this trend is inevitable. So, we plan for this. AcenTek is proud of the work environment we have created and are optimistic that we will continue to fill the voids left by these valuable team members with new, qualified candidates. "We will continue to evaluate new options that help with the work/life balance, both for existing staff and for our future hires," says Connor.

In addition to the staff being back in the office, our lobby is now open two days a week. For the past two years, AcenTek has successfully served you, our customer, remotely. While many of our customers have adapted to these new ways and found them to be far more convenient, some customers prefer to do business in person. For that reason, we have re-opened our lobby on Mondays and Thursdays, from 8:00am -4:30pm to serve you.

# An Update on Fiber Projects

Recent years have proven that fiber optics are essential to every customer. Despite the hurdles encountered due to the pandemic and supply chain issues, we continue to make progress on our goal of enhancing every customer's life by providing unparalleled services. Fiber optics make that mission a reality. While the amount of time and expense are substantial for every fiber build, we have a plan for how to bring fiber to more of our customers throughout 2022.

In April we began the final phase of the fiber build in our Waterville exchange. This phase includes 448 homes and will complete our fiber build to Waterville. Construction is estimated to conclude in late July with these customers enjoying the benefits of fiber-fed services by the middle of October. In total, the Waterville fiber project will reach 660 customers.

Last September, AcenTek was awarded a \$12.1 million dollar grant from the Empower Rural lowa Broadband Grant program. Our grant application proposed building fiber to Harpers Ferry, Fort Atkinson, Ossian and Clermont. This year we will begin work on these projects, starting in Clermont. All the engineering for the rural Clermont build is already complete and materials ordered. We are meeting with customers to find out who is interested in receiving a fiber drop to their home and gathering the information needed to begin construction. We estimate construction to begin later this summer or early fall.

In Minnesota, customers in Peterson will also receive fiber this year. We kicked off the project in late May and will include both rural customers and those living in the city limits. We are excited to add another 559 homes to the list of customers who are enjoying services fed by fiber. The estimated completion date for the construction phase is early September, with customers having their services switched over to fiber by December.

These three projects will bring fiber optics to approximately 1,325 more AcenTek customers before the end of 2022. We are excited to be able to continue building our fiber network, knowing the difference fiber will make in the lives of our customers.



We were excited to award 20 high school seniors with \$1,000 scholarships this spring. These deserving recipients are graduating seniors who have been accepted to a college or university and have AcenTek phone or broadband service in Minnesota, lowa, or Michigan. Over the past 21 years, AcenTek has given out \$405,000 to graduates in the communities we serve. Congratulations to this year's scholarship winners!

On April 19th, AcenTek held the 72nd Annual Meeting of the Members online. Congratulations to Lesa Moose, our new board member, announced at the meeting. Lesa will serve the portion of lowa, served by the Association. Congratulations also to incumbents, Garth Zenke (Winona County) and Joseph Thesing (Houston County) on their re-election. Special thanks to Bluff Country Financial Services for securely handling the ballots and tallying the results again this year. We had an impressive 1,513



ballots submitted; about 8 times as many as our in-person meetings yielded. One may conclude that this increase may be due to the convenience of being able to mail in the ballot, versus having to vote in person. AcenTek thanks every member who took time to vote in this year's election.

# Understanding Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is something many of us use daily, yet don't really understand how it works. Most of us don't really care to understand how it works, just that it does! But understanding a few things about Wi-Fi could improve your experience.

#### WHAT IS IT?

Wi-Fi is the wireless technology used to connect computers and other devices to the internet.

#### **HOW DOES IT WORK?**

A radio signal is sent from a router to a device, translating data into something you see and use.

# WHAT FACTORS IMPACT MY WI-FI CONNECTION?

- Age of your device: Older devices may not be able to reach faster speeds due to being built with older technology.
- Obstacles: Certain walls, cordless phones, certain appliances like microwaves or baby monitors can also cause interference.
- Your neighbors: Their wireless network can also interfere with yours since they can generate potential noise on the same frequency as your Wi-Fi.

# WHAT IS THE BEST OPTION FOR ROUTER?

You can purchase your own router and manage your Wi-Fi service if you choose to do so. Shop for a router that has been built with the most current technology.

If you are not very tech-savvy, simply subscribe to Wi-Fi services through AcenTek. Our Wi-Fi service provides current technology at just \$4.95/month. When you subscribe to AcenTek Wi-Fi, technical support is also included.

# **Channel Numbers Changing**

At the end of June, video customers will notice a change to their service. Many channel numbers are changing. No channels are leaving our lineup, but your favorite shows may soon be on a new channel. This change will take place at the end of June. Community, music and premium channels (HBO, Cinemax, Showtime and Starz Encore) will not be affected. Realigning the channels let the different



viewing genres to be organized together, while also allowing room for adding HD channels, as they become available. This change will not impact your DVR library or parental controls.

Customers in Minnesota will notice the updated lineup on June 28th, while customers in Iowa will see the change on June 29th. All video customers received a new lineup brochure with their June bill. (If you are an E-bill customer, you received yours via email.) You can also access your lineup on our website by clicking on the video link and typing in your zip code. This new lineup brochure reflects the new channel numbers so you can easily find your favorite channel.
